SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

“The regatta activities must be performed in accordance with the provisions on contrast and containment of the diffusion of COVID 19 issued by the Federation that the Organizing Committees will activate and to which the participating members must comply under the supervision of the Organizing Committee itself. Any cases of COVID 19 that should be detected during the event will be reported by the Organizing Committee to the competent health bodies in charge”

1 RULES

1.1 This event will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021 – 2024 (RRS), the Dart Class Rules and the Notice of Race.

The present Sailing Instructions and their Amendments, which will prevail in case of conflict. This modify the RRS 63.7.

2 AMENDMENTS TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the ON-LINE Official Notice Board. Notices may be sent via WhatsApp when practicable. Failure to Send or Receive a notice via WhatsApp will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

2.2 Should the schedule be modified, the start-time of the concerned race will be posted on the ON-LINE Official Notice-board <https://www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/3736/event> before 7:00 Pm or before the protest time limit whichever is the later, the day before it will take effect.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole in front of the ladies restrooms.

3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signal AP. This changes race signals AP

4 SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1 Ten races are scheduled:

Monday	22 nd	August 2022	13:00h	Practice race
Tuesday	23 th	August 2022	13:00h	Races (2)
Wednesday/Friday	24-26 th	August 2022	13:00h	Races (2 per day)
Saturday	27 th	August 2022		Races (2) & Prize giving

A maximum of 2 races per day will be held. It will be possible to perform the 3^o race to retrieve a race which was not possible to make, or in case of a risky prediction for the next day.

4.2 To constitute a series, 4 races must be accomplished.

4.3 On the last day of the regatta, 27th August, no warning signal will be made after 3.30 pm.

5 RACING AREA

6 COURSE AND MARKS

6.1 The diagram in Attachment B shows the Course;

6.2 Start 1 – 2 – 3a/3b - 1 - 2 – 3a/3b – 1 - 2 – 3a/3b - Finish

6.3 Mark “F” will be an orange mark hoisting a BLUE Flag.

6.4 CHANGE OF THE COURSE AFTER START

The course will not be changed. This change the rule 33 of RRS.

7 THE START

7.1 The starting signals will be given in accordance with RRS 26.

7.2 The Class Flag for Dart will be the DART logo on white background.

7.3 Boats started later than 5 minutes after the starting signal will be scored DNS without hearing (This changes of RRS A4 and A5).

7.4 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the R.C. boat and a GREEN Mark to be left to port.

8 THE FINISH

8.1 The finishing line will be between a staff on the Race Committee boat displaying an BLUE flag and the mark “F” positioned leeward of the Committee boat, to leave starboard.



9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 The RRS 44 is modified so that the 2 (two) turns are replaced by 1 (one) turn.

10 TIME LIMIT

10.1 The time limit is 60 min.

10.2 Boats failing to finish **within 20 minutes** after the first boat will be scored DNF without hearing (This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5).

11 PROTESTS

11.1 Protest forms are available only online: <https://www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/3736/event>

Protests shall be submitted within the protest time limit.

11.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day. The same time limit applies to protests by the race committee and by the protest committee about incidents they observe in the racing area and to requests for redress. This changes rules 61.3 and 62.2.

11.3 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the jury room, located at the Clubhouse, beginning at the posted time.

11.4 Notices of protests by the race committee or jury will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).

11.5 On the last day of the regatta a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered:

(a) Within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day;

(b) No later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day.

This changes rule 66;

11.6 On the last day of the regatta a request for redress from a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.

12. SCORING

11.1 Appendix A, Low point system, will apply.

11.2 Four races are required to constitute the Championship a series.

11.3 When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11.4 When 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

13 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

13.1 Substitution of crew members will not be allowed without a prior written approval of the Race Committee.

13.2 Substitution of damaged equipment will not be allowed without approval of the R. C.

14 PRIZES

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.

The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

16 SAFETY

16.1 "November" ("N") over "Answering Pennant" ("AP") displayed on the R.C. boats with repetitive sounds means: WARNING, all the boats have to escape to the nearest safety area.

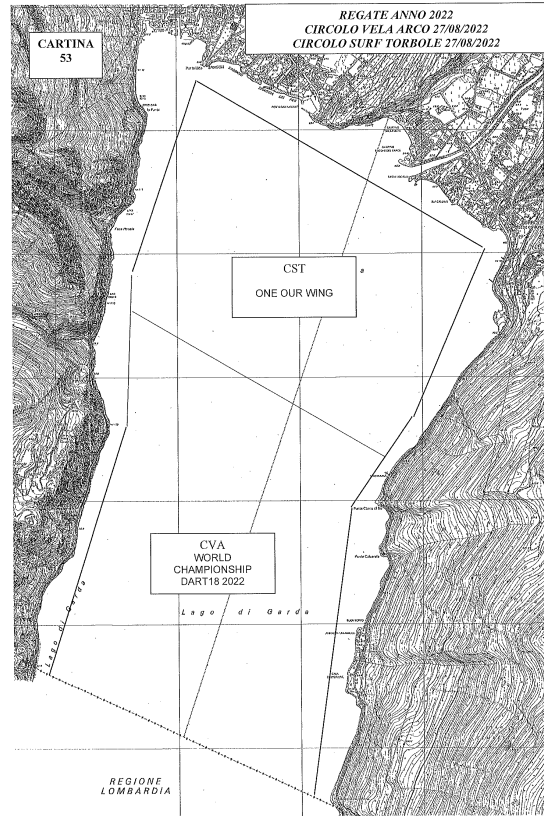
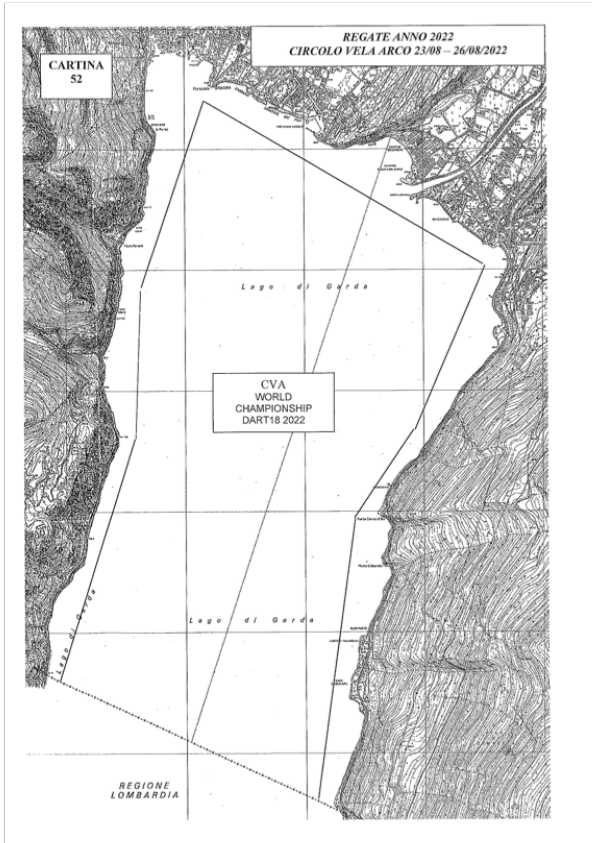
17 MEDIA

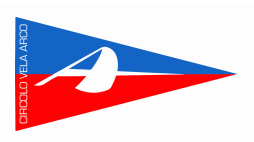
