Supplementary Sailing Instructions to RRS Appendix S: Standard Sailing Instructions (SSI)

The rules below replace or complement the SSI's. The same number is used when replacing an SSI and new numbers are used for new instructions.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a kiteboard may not protest another kiteboard for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.3 NOR 7.1 is replaced with 'Formula Kite (Foiling) competitors shall submit a completed competitors equipment checklist registration form during competitor check-in prior to 1100 on August 18, 2022.'

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the online official notice board is located at: <https://www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/3208/event>
As a courtesy to the competitors the notices may be posted on a board at the local on-site race office.
- 2.3 The local on-site race office will be near the flagpole at the Lake Ontario Park (LOP) launch site.

3 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted 30 minutes before it will take effect. Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located at the launch site.

4.2 When flag L is displayed ashore over a numeral pennant. The numeral pennant indicates the number of the notice to competitors that is posted. This changes race signal L.

4.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 20 minutes' in the RRS race signal AP.

5.3 The race committee may run one extra race on a day provided that they do not get more than one race ahead of schedule and do not exceed the number of total races scheduled for the event.

6 CLASS FLAG

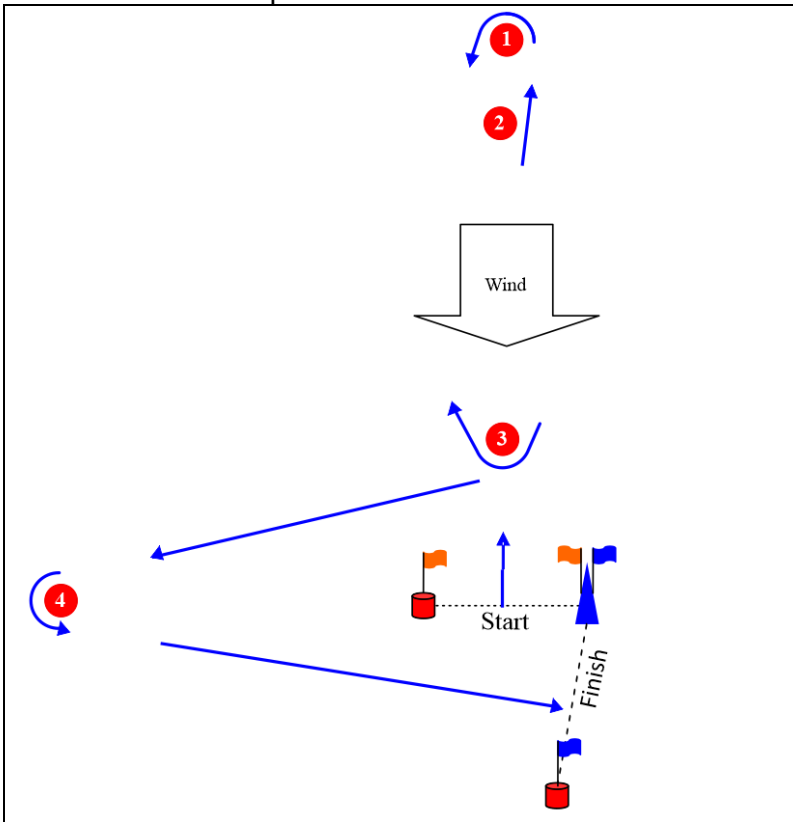

7 COURSES

7.3 The racing area will be in Lake Ontario south of Elevator Bay Pier.

7.4 Courses will not be shortened. This changes RRS 32.

7.5 The course below replaces the courses in the SSI:



7.6 The course to sail is a two lap course (Start-2p-1p-2p-3s-2p-1p-2p-3s-4p-Finish). Kiteboards may select to sail a one lap course (Start-2p-1p-2p-3s-4p-Finish) by notifying the race committee prior to the warning signal. Kiteboards that complete two laps will be ranked before kiteboards that completed one lap.

8 MARKS

9 THE START

9.1 Races will be started by using Appendix F RRS 26.

9.3 A kiteboard that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

11 THE FINISH

11.2 If the race committee determines that the finishing order of some kiteboards in a race is unlikely to change, it may use reasonable discretion to score those kiteboards still racing points equal to their position in the race. This changes RRS A3, A4 and A5.2.

12 TIME LIMITS

12.4 Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

13 PROTEST AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

13.5 Hearing requests shall be submitted online. In exceptional circumstances paper versions will be accepted in the Race Office.

15 COMMUNICATIONS

15.1 The race committee will be operating on VHF channel 11.

16 RACE OFFICE

16.1 The local on-site race office will be near the flagpole at the Lake Ontario Park (LOP) launch site.

17 [NP] [DP] SAFETY REGULATIONS

17.1 When flag V over flag H is displayed with one sound signal all kiteboards shall return promptly and directly to the launch site. Further signals ashore.

17.2 RRS 37 is changed so that it applies when flag V or flag V over flag H is displayed with one sound.

17.3 All competitors shall Check-out at the local on-site race office.

17.4 All kiteboards shall return directly to the launch site and shall Check-in at the local on-site race office after completing their last race of the day.

17.5 A kiteboard that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

17.6 Competitors who require assistance should wave one arm with hand open. If no assistance is required, the arm should be waved with fist closed.

17.7 Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from regatta officials.

17.8 A personal flotation device or impact vest meeting the Formula Kite Class Rules meets the requirements of NOR 1.2.

18 [DP] REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT

18.1 In the event of damage, kiteboards and equipment may only be substituted with permission of the race committee. Equipment Substitution applications is available on the online Official Notice Board. Permission must be received from the race committee prior to substitution, except as provided in SI 18.2

18.2 If the damage occurs less than 2 hours before the first scheduled start on a racing day, and before the start of the last race of the day, the competitor shall verbally notify the race committee before using the equipment in a race. The Equipment Substitution application referred to in SI 18.1 shall then be submitted before the end of the protest time limit at the end of the day in which the substitution takes place.

20 OFFICIAL VESSELS

20.1 Official vessels will be marked as follows:

Safety/patrol	A yellow flag with a centered vertical red stripe
Jury	A code flag J
Media	A flag with the letter "M" on contrasting background

20.2 Failure of a committee vessel to display an identifying flag will not be grounds for redress under RRS 60.1(b).

21 [DP][NP] LAUNCH AREA AND SITE REGULATIONS

21.1 All kiteboards shall be launched and hauled out as directed by the organizing authority.

21.2 Automobiles and other vehicles must be parked only in accordance with the City of Kingston and the organizing authority's posted signage.
