



OPEN TROPHY KALAMAKIA 2021 NAUTICAL CLUB OF KALAMAKI 17 – 19 DECEMBER 2021

NOTICE OF RACE

1. Organizing Authority

Kalamakia 2021 is organized by Nautical Club of Kalamaki in conjunction with Hellenic Sailing Federation.

2. Rules

2.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in «The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-2024» and the following rules:

2.1.1 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, will apply. Rule P 2.3 will not apply and rule P 2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.

2.1.2 The first three sentences of RRS 61.1(a) are changed to ‘The protesting boat shall inform the Race Committee at the finishing line immediately after finishing of the boat/s being protested, or as soon as practicable after she retires.’

2.2 In all rules governing this regatta:

Both ‘athlete’ and ‘competitor’ mean a person competing or intending to compete in the event.

2.3 [NP] denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

2.4 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

3. COVID-19 Protocols

3.1 Protocols and prescription regarding the COVID-19 may be published at any time. They will state if they have the status of a rule.

3.2 These special Covid-19 protocols will be published two weeks before the start of the event. The protocols may include the need for testing competitors on arrival, testing on site during the event, daily temperature measurement and the need to

wear masks indoors.

- 3.3 [NP] All event participants are required to make themselves aware of all protocols regarding COVID 19 set forth by the Greek Government, Sports Authorities and / or the Organizing authority and must comply with those prescriptions at all times during the event. These prescriptions or links to them will be published on the event web page. - 3.4 [NP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official. Failure to comply may be regarded as misconduct.
- 3.5 Reasonable actions by event officials to implement COVID-19 guidance, protocols, or legislation, even if they later prove to have been unnecessary, are not improper actions or omissions.

4. Sailing Instructions

- 4.1 The sailing instructions along with other governing documents will be available from 15 of December 2021 on the official notice board of the event.

5. Notices to Competitors

6. Eligibility and Entries

- 6.1 The event is open to competitors sailing on boats of the Optimist class that fulfill the eligibility requirements stated below.
- 6.2 Competitors shall have been born in 2006 or later.
- 6.3 To be eligible for entry, Greek competitors shall have a valid Sports ID issued by the Hellenic Sailing Federation and as provided by the state law.
- 6.4 Competitors shall deliver a signed and completed parent (or guardian) consent and declaration form.
- 6.5 The organizing authority may postpone or cancel the event at any time if it considers that this is required by reasons related to COVID-19. The competitors are not entitled to claim any compensation for any expenses they have incurred for their participation or preparation for participation in the event.

6.6 The organizing authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.

7. Entry Fees

7.1 Entry fee will be Euro 40 per competitor.

7.2 Fees are stated in euros, shall be given the time of arrival at the registration desk.

7.3 Meals are included in the entry fee for the duration of the Event (Racing Days).

7.4 Lunch Boxes are included in the entry fee for the duration of the Event (Racing Days).

7.5 Gifts will be drawn to competitors at the end of the first 2 racing days. The draw will be made with the sail number of each boat.

7.6 Gifts will be also awarded to all winners.

8. [DP] Advertising

8.1 The World Sailing Advertising Code will apply.

8.2 Boats carrying personal advertising must present the permission of their National Authority. A copy of this permission shall be delivered to the organizing authority.

8.3 Boats may be required to display advertising and bow numbers chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

9. Schedule

9.1 The event schedule will be as follows:

- 9.2 Nine (9) races are scheduled for the event.
- 9.3 No more than four (4) races will be sailed in any scheduled day.
- 9.4 On the last day, no warning signal will be made after 15:30 h.

10. Racing Format - Course

Boats will be divided into groups as per the table below:

1 st	U16		2006 – 2009
2 nd		U16	2006 – 2009
3 rd	U12	U12	2010 - 2014

The Course will be the official IODA Course for Fleet Race.

11. [DP] Inspections

- 11.1 Each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate, if required.
- 11.2 The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor to comply with the class rules and the rules set out in this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.
- 11.3 Boats or equipment may be inspected at any time during the event.
- 11.4 While afloat, a race official may instruct a boat to sail to an inspection area, promptly, for inspection.

12. Scoring

- 12.1 If less than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When four (4) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12.2 The event is valid if one (1) race is complete.
- 12.3 For the needs of the prize giving (NoR 19.1), subgroups results will be exported from the overall results.

13. [NP][DP] Support Boats

- 13.1 All support boats must be registered to the organizing authority and are required

to be insured and comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations. The organizing authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at her discretion.

- 13.2 To register for the event each support boat must send the documents needed (insurance and drivers license) to the organizing authority. Registration will be completed on December 14st 2021.
- 13.3 Support persons must wear Personal Floatation Devices at all times other than for brief periods while adding or removing clothing. With the motor running they are required to wear the Quick Stop / Kill Cord at all times.
- 13.4 Support persons in the race course area, shall be able to communicate with the Race Committee via VHF Radio during racing. The radio channel will be given in the Sailing Instructions.

14. [DP] Code of Behavior

- 14.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from a regatta official.
- 14.2 Competitors and support persons shall handle any boats or equipment provided by the organizing authority with proper care and seamanship, and in compliance with any written instructions.
- 14.3 Boats not racing shall avoid the area where boats are racing and any official boats.

15. Disclaimer of Liability

- 15.1 RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.”
- 15.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.
- 15.3 By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - 15.3.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
 - 15.3.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, the, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
 - 15.3.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission.
 - 15.3.4 Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
 - 15.3.5 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.

- 15.3.6 It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the event and to attend any competitor briefing held for this event.

16. Insurance

- 16.1 Every participating boat must be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance, that is suitable for the racing area, with a minimum coverage of 540,000 euro per incident, or the equivalent.
- 16.2 The support boats must be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with the minimum cover of Greek Law. Regardless, it is the responsibility of the support persons in charge of the boats registered, to hold adequate insurance cover for Tort Liability and Third-Party Insurance (Property and Persons).
- 16.3 A copy of the insurance coverage must be delivered with the registration.
- 16.4 The organizing authority is not responsible for verifying the status or validity of those insurance certificates.

17. Media Rights

- 17.1 By participating in the event competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 17.2 Competitors may be required to be available for interviews at the regatta.

18. Data Protection

- 18.1 In order to manage the event, information may be provided by competitors will be held on a database. The management of personal information and images will comply with the General Data Protection Regulations that came into effect in May 2018.

19. Prizes

- 19.1 Prizes will be awarded to the best three (3) Boys and three (3) Girls as per the tables below.
The first Boy and Girl of the race should be the winners of the trophy.
