Response:

I am Mike the judge at the event, and am making a comment though the race committee may do separately.

If boats were paddling they broke rules 42 and, you should have hailed protest, and then lodged a hearing request within the protest time limit.

If they were not within hailing distance, you needed to inform them of your complaint at the first reasonable opportunity when ashore.

If you did not do this your protest would be invalid. Meaning I cannot hear it.

The finishing boat scored them where he saw them and I do not think did anything wrong.

The finish boat should not have told you to put in a scoring request, it should have told you to protest the boats, or if incorrect scoring made a request for redress to the protest committee.

I believe you did not protest the boats as you should have, but I have not taken any evidence on this.

I do not believe the finishing boat made an "act or omission" allowing you redress. For the incorrect advice to file this request, it is an "act or omission" so opening the door to redress, but it can only be granted if you were not at fault, and you are supposed to know the rules.

I fear nothing can now be done but for good reason I can relax some time limits to allow you to have a say.

You should either lodge now your request for redress, or protest.
